Oral Cancers

One of the main reasons for regular dental examinations is because mouth cancer kills one person every 3 hours in the UK due to late detection.

Dentists are trained to spot mouth cancer at a treatable early stage.

Let us know if you have:-

1. An ulcer that does not heal in three weeks
2. A lump or overgrowth of tissue
3. A white or red patch on the mouth lining
4. Difficulty in swallowing, chewing or moving the tongue or jaw
5. Numbness of the mouth or tongue
6. A feeling that something is caught in the throat
7. Persistent chronic sore throat or voice change for six weeks
8. Jaw swelling causing denture problems
9. Neck swelling for three weeks
10. Unexplained tooth mobility for three weeks

Are your teeth worn down? - Tooth Surface Loss (TSL)

In the past the main problems associated with the mouth were tooth decay and gum disease. A new phenomenon has arisen, due to the fact that we are living longer and is known as Tooth Surface Loss (TSL). There are three causes of this - tooth erosion, abrasion and attrition.

Tooth erosion

Erosion is a chemical process in which the tooth surface is removed in the absence of plaque. These are due to fresh fruit juices, carbonated drinks, alcoholic beverages etc and some foods. It can also be caused by gastro-oesophageal reflux and eating disorders.

Tooth abrasion

Abrasion is caused by anything with an abrasive effect such as overbrushing with a toothbrush.

Tooth attrition

Attrition is a process in which tooth tissue is removed as a result of opposing tooth surfaces contacting during function and/or during parafunction.

Bruxism is the grinding, tapping and/or clenching of one's teeth when you are not using your teeth for chewing food. Most bruxists grind their teeth at night while they are sleeping, particularly during their dream phase. In addition to increased wear, bruxists often break bits off their teeth as they weaken which can lead to further treatment and terminal fractures.

In order to prevent and possibly treat the effects of TSL it is vital to understand the causes of the nature in each particular individual. Often several components are present at any one time; however, we usually find that one of these causes is the major cause and one or both of the others is less significant. Once the main cause has been identified, we will then work out suggested solutions to deal with the problem. At future appointments, we will check to see the problem has been stabilised, or at the very least, slowed down. Often the success of our advice needs to be reviewed over several years as the process of tooth surface loss is often slow and subtle. However, the damage caused can be considerable if the causes are not stopped.

It's a good sign if the teeth become less sensitive and if the frequency of small parts of the teeth breaking off producing rough edges becomes less.

How do we decide what treatment is required?

First we need to find the cause of the problem, and then find out if we can control these factors.

We may suggest dietary changes to reduce the levels of acid, a more gentle brushing techniques to reduce any effects of over brushing or fit a mouthguard (a device that fits over the teeth and is worn at night) to reduce the impact of tooth grinding.

Replacement of lost tooth surface is often now possible with composite resin or more commonly known as "white fillings". They are now stronger, harder wearing, more aesthetic and reliable than ever. Composite resins are able to restore the shape and function of a tooth by allowing the dentist to chemically bond the material, layer by layer onto the worn or broken tooth.

Alternatively, crowns may prove to be a longer lasting solution.
